

Discipleship: Following The Way Of The Lord Jesus

Jesus is the vine who calls us to abide in Him. Rather than living our own way, we grow to live His way, and He supplies all we need in order to do that. It's the only way to truly live forever.

All you have to do, says Jesus, is *Remain in me*, remain <u>attached</u> to me so that my truth, my love, my compassion, my life can flow into you.

Only when we are attached to Him, can Jesus provides our sustenance for the daily challenges of living. We do that by listening to Him, watching Him, and living by the power of His Spirit working in us.

But, staying connected to Jesus and to one another in a mutual relationship of love and fidelity does not happen automatically. It takes effort. It takes commitment. Simply put, it takes work!

Nor is it an end in itself. Branches of the vine produce leaves and fruit. Only by remaining connected to Him, as a branch is connected to a vine, can we bear the fruit of Christlike living.

In the gospel today, Jesus speaks repeatedly of *fruit*. Our Lord's primary concern is not our comfort or happiness, but that we bear fruit. We need to let the gardener prune the selfishness and self-centeredness out of our lives so that we can truly remain in Jesus and bear fruit for His kingdom, fruit that will last. Then others will enjoy God's goodness and be drawn to Him also.

The Lord promises that we will bear much fruit if we abide in Him and allow Him to purify us. Then you will produce the fruit that God loves to see!

What is the Eucharist?

The Eucharist is the source and summit of the Christian life. The term "Eucharist" originates from the Greek word *eucharistia*, meaning thanksgiving.

In the celebration of the Eucharist, bread and wine become the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ through the power of the Holy Spirit and the instrumentality of the priest. The whole Christ is truly present -- body, blood, soul, and divinity -- under the appearances of bread and wine, the glorified Christ who rose from the dead. This is what the Church means when she speaks of the "Real Presence" of Christ in the Eucharist.



Why does Jesus give himself to us as food and drink?

Jesus gives himself to us in the Eucharist as spiritual nourishment because he loves us. By eating the Body and drinking the Blood of Christ in the Eucharist, we become united to the person of Christ through his humanity. "Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me and I in him" (Jn 6:56). In being united to the humanity of Christ, we are at the same time united to his divinity. Our mortal and corruptible natures are transformed by being joined to the source of life. -The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCS)


