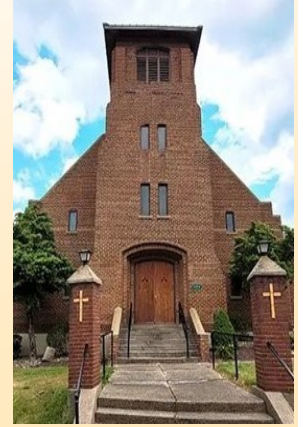

WEDDINGS: Couples must meet with the pastor at least twelve months in advance of the planned marriage date.

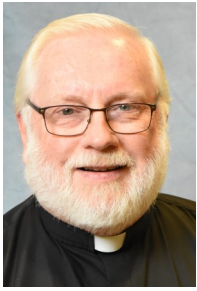
BAPTISMS: Call the pastor to schedule & prepare for Baptism.

From the Pastor

We come to Jesus at prayer on the Mountain. At peace, at prayer, He is transfigured into a state that reflects the glory of God. Moses and Elijah appear.

They are talking with Jesus about His passing, His exodus, His going from this life into the fullness of God's life. They were talking about His mission, about how Jesus had to go to Jerusalem, be crucified and rise victorious over death.

God wants to transform our world. Following him does not mean just performing certain actions, like coming to Church. Following Him means entering a spiritual, mystical relationship with Him. We cannot be asleep spiritually as Peter, James, and John were. We have to nourish our relationship with Him. We have to feed our spiritual lives the food of union with God.

This is my chosen Son; listen to him, the Voice calls out from heaven. We pray that these will be the words we carry with us as we leave church today. We pray we will go back into our daily life ready to listen to Jesus, to where he leads us, to what he asks of us.

As Jesus began his journey to Jerusalem, he invites his disciples to come with him, to enter into his way of giving himself over in love in order to transform our world. We pray for the grace to listen to Jesus, to be people of prayer. We have to respond to His message in our hearts.

We have to listen. We have to grow. He is transforming the world. He is starting with us.

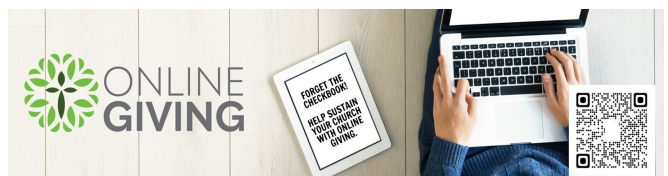

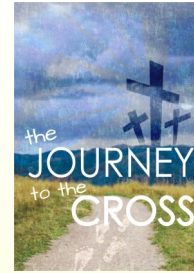

Christ said to us thru the apostle James: 'Are there people sick among you? Let them send for the priests of the Church, and let the priests pray over them anointing them with oil in the name of the Lord. The prayer of faith will save the sick persons, and the Lord will raise them up. If they have committed any sins, their sins will be forgiven them.' All are invited to attend Mass with the Anointing of the Sick on Mon, March 24, at 6:00pm, at St Cecilia Church. Everyone is invited to come if you are: suffering from serious or chronic illness of mind or body; facing surgery or a serious medical procedure or testing; experiencing the debilitations and aches & pains of growing old; or limited by any type of mental or physical impairment. If you are in need of prayer for healing in body, mind or spirit, we encourage you to come.

Saint of the week March 19 SAINT JOSEPH, HUSBAND OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY Joseph, someone once joked, was indeed the perfect husband: the only major character in Jesus' story who never utters a word! But the Gospel recounts and the liturgy celebrates his silent witness of faith-filled deeds: 'With a husband's love he cherished Mary, the Virgin Mother of God; with fatherly care he watched over Jesus' (Preface of Saint Joseph, Sacramentary). Catholic devotion, therefore, hails him as patron-protector of the universal Church. Some cultures set a festive 'Saint Joseph's Table,' welcoming the poor and strangers to feast with family and friends. Tradition keeps today as the anniversary of his death, which we presume was peaceful, with Jesus and Mary present. Thus, Catholics invoke Joseph as 'patron of a happy death.' Descended from David's house, which God finished 'building' through Joseph's provision of a home for Mary and Jesus, he was, fittingly, a carpenter by trade; thus, patron of workers. Spring, nature's rebirth, begins between his feast and Annunciation (March 25), appropriately, since Joseph's silent obedience and Mary's 'Let it be done to me according to your word' (Luke 1:38) usher in humanity's spiritual rebirth. —Peter Scagnelli

THE BENEDICTINE CROSS RESTORATION PROJECT

Starting in the fall of 2021 a small group of volunteers started cleaning the cast iron Benedictine crosses in the Saint Vincent Cemetery. Following that cleaning, Dr. Michael Krom's Saint Vincent College students sprayed Rustoleum over those crosses. Next volunteers applied an industrial primer and then a high gloss enamel paint to each of the crosses.



That process continued through the summers for the next 3 years, and as of last fall 700 crosses have been painted! The new coats of paint should last for the next two decades!

Looking forward to the warm days of spring, we will be replacing the sealant between the bottom of the crosses and their cement bases. This process is labor intensive but easy to do.
