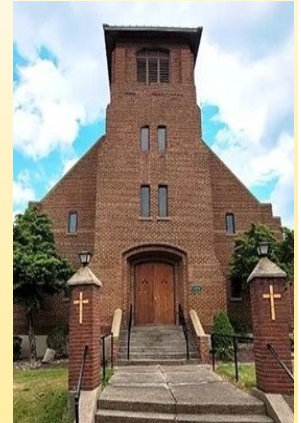

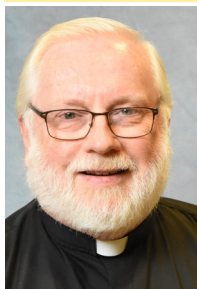

From the Pastor

Jesus told us to pray. In Luke's Gospel, He says: *Ask, and it will be given to you.* Jesus tells us in John's Gospel: *If you ask for anything in my name, I will do it.*

In today's gospel, Jesus tells us this strange story of a really bad judge, and a poor widow who was denied justice. She asks and asks, but gets no answer!

Why do we pester God with prayer? God knows our needs. We do not have to tell God. God knows our needs and is eager to meet them. God is not like this judge. God will not delay in helping those who cry to him day and night. If a judge who does not care will do this for a widow, then how much more will God do for God's people? When God's people turn to God in prayer, help and justice WILL come their way.

Actually, WE ourselves are more like that unjust judge, *who neither feared God or respected people.* Dominated by our egos, we look for what is in it for us. And, like the widow, God is persistent in love for us, the hound of heaven who wears us down, like the widow, by persistently pursuing us. Eventually, we let God enter our lives and guide us to conversion and justice.

Jesus told us to pray. Pray even when prayer seems futile. Pray even when all seems lost. Pray always and not lose heart. When we pray, something happens. We change. Prayer forces us from self-reliance to dependence on God. When we're close to God thru prayer, we live a God-centered life, not a self-centered life. But will we ever learn?

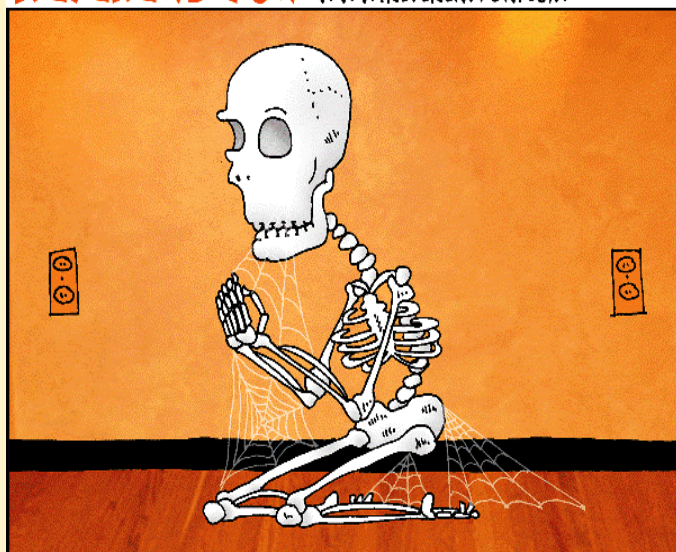

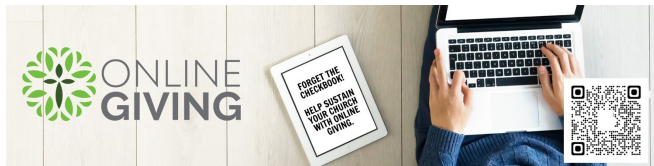

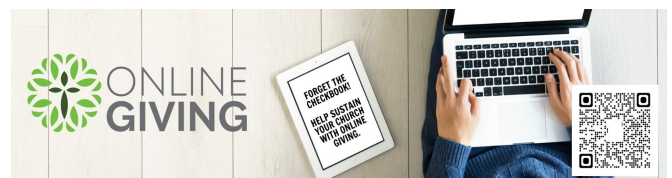
