

From the Pastor

In our Gospel today, Jesus tells us what we should do if we are angry with someone, or call someone a bad name or curse them. He said, If you are presenting your offering to God and you remember that you have said something that hurt another person, leave your gift at the altar and go and ask forgiveness from that person. Then come back and offer your gift to God.

So before we give our offering today: Have I been angry with someone this week? Have I had any arguments lately? Have I called someone a bad name? Have I said something about someone that wasn't true?

If so, we should ask God to forgive us and we should go to the person we have hurt and ask them to forgive us. When we have done that, God will be pleased with our offering.

Realize that our words and actions -- even the tone of what we say and do -- can affect others, for good or ill. Sometimes, we miss the obvious ways we impart our morals and beliefs to our children. Our words and actions, our attitudes and perceptions, teach them far more about our faith, than the dogmas we articulate and the prayers we say.

Faith is more than doctrine, or feelings in our heart. What we say, what we do, how we decide, as well as our compassion for others, even our business practices, are all expressions of our faith in God. Authentic faith requires integrity: living what we believe, working for what we pray for, becoming what we receive in God's Word and sacrament.
