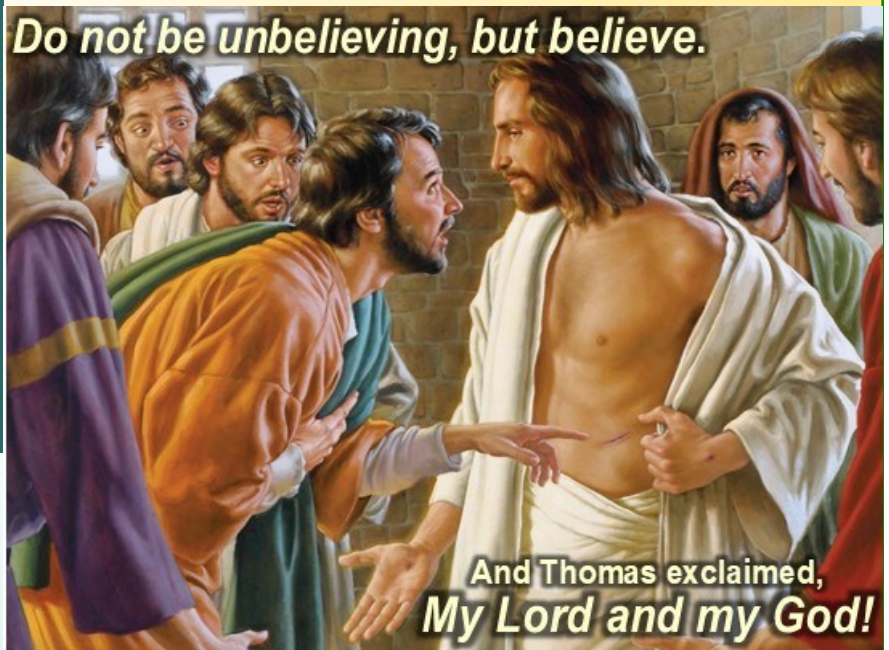

WEDDINGS: Couples must meet with the pastor at least twelve months in advance of the planned marriage date.

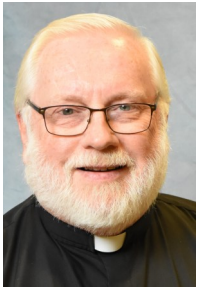
BAPTISMS: Call the pastor to schedule & prepare for Baptism.

From the Pastor

If Jesus had not risen from the dead and appeared to His disciples, we would never have heard of Him. Nothing else could have changed sad and despairing men and women into people radiant with joy and courage.

Peace be with you, He says. As the Father sent me, so I send you! The Risen Lord calls His disciples to service. Today, we are the ones Jesus sends as messengers of the Lord's peace and forgiveness.

Receive the Holy Spirit! The Risen Jesus breaths His Spirit into His disciples, the same Spirit that is breathed into us at our baptism and confirmation.

In a world that is so wounded, it's not enough just to hear: *He is risen! Alleluia!* Sometimes, like Thomas, we need to see the wounds of Christ for ourselves. And the good news is that Jesus did show to Thomas His hands, and let him touch His side and said: *Do not be unbelieving, but believe!* And what was Thomas' response? He responds with the highest expression of faith in the entire gospel: *My Lord and my God!*

We live in a wounded world - a world that cannot heal itself. But we serve a God who can heal us. For Christ is risen -- wounds and all -- and He commissions us to be agents of healing: to preach peace and to offer forgiveness.

And when we do -- even when we ourselves are wounded -- we bring new life to this wounded world, healing the hurt and pain and resentments that weigh lives down.

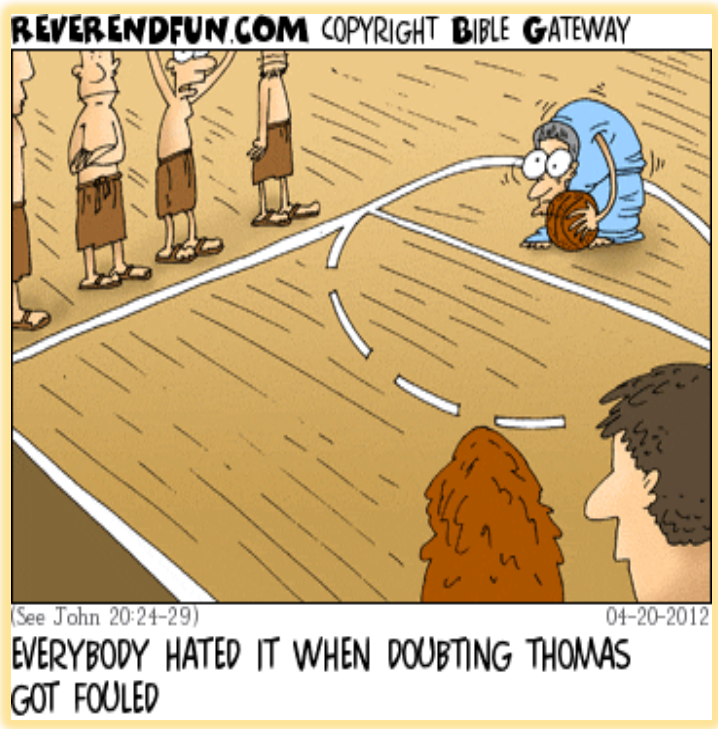
By loving one another as Jesus loves, we can begin to heal this broken world even now.

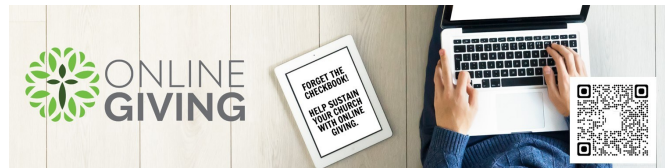

MONK'S PARISH AMONG THOSE ASSISTING GRANDPARENTS

Some snowflakes were tiny, some large. Some perfect circles, some tiny dots, some larger blots. All shades of blue. The canvases were white, the color of the snowmen they were painting. One small boy came to the front of the room to ask Miss Jan, a volunteer, for a new paint tray as his didn't have enough orange and he was working on the carrot nose.

A taller teenager helped the volunteers with the children in the class, tables covered in newspapers to catch any overpainting. The bright room was filled with the happy voices of children wanting to share their creations.

"Don't forget to sign your name on the back," Miss Jan said as another boy re-entered the room, coming from the bathroom down the hall, traces of blue paint still covering both hands. But it was okay. They were just having fun. They were all friends.

Downstairs, in the church hall, a buffet filled with pasta dishes, chicken, mac and cheese and a festive section of cookies and cakes almost needed a third table for its bountiful offerings. Volunteers in the corner table shared a meal after serving the adults and



children who were there. The adults quietly conversed before the presentation to come, enjoying some time while the kids were upstairs. The kids were their grandchildren.

This was a meeting of the group called Grandparents Raising Grandchildren and it was being held at Saint Cecilia Parish in Whitney, which is pastored by Father James Podlesny, O.S.B., a monk of Saint Vincent Archabbey. The group has been around for about six years and Father Jim is quick to point out that it's not only an ecumenical effort with other churches in the area, but

that every participant, every grandparent, every volunteer, every child is an important part of the group.

The grandparents this snowy January night would hear a presentation on anxiety. While her generation became known as Generation X, the presenter, Mari Beth Elder posited, this current cohort could someday be called "The Anxious Generation."

She had them right away as the presentation quickly evolved into sharing stories about growing up at a time where no one was afraid to let their kids roam the neighborhood or play on a playground's jungle gym. Not like the present-day where the extra digit on every child's hand—and many adults' hands—is digital, in the form of a phone. Many kids don't know how to complete simple chores, such as operating a washing machine, or a dishwasher. Many, she said, don't even have "jobs" at home. But when it comes to posting a video or a social media meme, they're experts.

"Social media brings anxiety because it paints a picture of life that is not as it truly is," she said. An example, she noted, was

bullying. For Generation X, if someone was bullied on a school bus, when they got off the bus the bully was physically gone. But for the digital generation, the bully is present every minute of every day on a child's digital device.

The idea for the group came from Deacon Mark Ferlin and his wife Kathy, a teacher. He belongs to Saint Cecilia Parish, while she is a member of Trinity Lutheran. Deacon Ferlin is a graduate of Saint Vincent Seminary. One night while at dinner in a local restaurant the topic of grandparents raising their grandchildren came up.

Whether these circumstances were the results of their childrens' addictions, incarceration, an accident or some other tragedy, the Ferlins knew there were people out there who needed help, especially in navigating child-rearing in a digital generation that differs so much from their days as parents. Since Mark is Catholic and Kathy a Lutheran, and the issue transcends a particular faith, they knew they wanted to make the effort ecumenical. So, in addition to Father Jim, they also involved then-pastor Jeffrey Schock at Trinity Lutheran and present-day pastors Jason and Jess Felici.

People come from throughout the county—North Huntingdon, Irwin, Delmont, Export, Ligonier—to attend programming, which

alternates locations between Saint Cecilia and Trinity Lutheran. The monthly meetings can draw more than 40 grandparents and grandchildren, although attendance was light in January due to snow. Volunteers help prepare and serve a meal, then the children go to a well-supervised classroom while the adults hear about various topics, including health insurance, aging, financial planning, anxiety and anger.

Local restaurants have supported the program with donations, Father Jim said, as have many others. Many participants hear about the program through word-of-mouth advertising, although recent newspaper and magazine articles are helping to spread the word. The meetings are also an opportunity for grandparents to create peer networks, as their grandchildren's peers may have parents that are half their ages—and their issues may be different.

Many grandparents, Father Jim said, are living on a fixed income, and some have had to go back to work due to the added expense of raising a grandchild.

"There are all kinds of issues. How do you deal with that kind of stress, with the anger?" he asked. The program organizers asked the grandparents what they need help in, and the answers to those questions help them plan topics and speakers for the meetings.

There are also group activities, such as the recent Christmas party, which was held at Trinity Lutheran. The women of Trinity got together and made enough quilts so that every child in the program received one. And not only did they each get a quilt, Miss Jan said, but the quilts were spread out on the pews and each child got to select the one he or she wanted. As an activity in their art time, the children were then asked to make thank-you cards depicting their quilts, which will be given to the crafters who made the items. The ecumenical aspect of the program is important, Deacon Ferlin and Father Jim both noted. They don't ask what faith people are, but they frequently find that they have a faith, a spirituality. That's what has brought them as far as they've come.

"The big thing," Father Jim said, "is networking. It helps when they talk to each other. When they talk [amongst themselves], they realize that there are others who are going through this, whom they can talk to. It may be as simple as saying 'this is a good doctor,' or who to avoid, or a tip on navigating health insurance."


He says he has seen a difference in the grandparents. "They think they're the only ones. Then they find that they're not alone, that there are others going through this. It's such a relief."


